CONGRATULATIONS TO CURT BROWN: Curt was inducted into the Missouri Broadcaster's Hall of Fame on June 2, 2012. His career began as a radio sales rep in Columbia in 1955. He went on the air in Osage Beach in 1956, just before being drafted into the U.S. Army. After his military service, Curt became Program Director of KWOS radio in Jefferson City before moving to sales at KWTO radio in Springfield in 1961, he was promoted to GM of KTTS/AM/FM in Springfield. He remained in that position for 31 years, before his retirement in 1999. His many accomplishments include keeping KTTS on top of the Springfield Arbitron rating for 27 straight years and hiring the first female sales rep., the first female on-air reporter and first female DJ in the Springfield market. Curt and his wife, Dee, live at 4613 Turnberry.

FLOWERBED COMMITTEE: Our subdivision is known for beautiful flowerbeds, and the committee feels that it is important to properly maintain them. On Friday, May 11, 2012, fourteen flowerbed committee volunteers gathered at the pavilion area to weed and plant in the flowerbeds around the pavilion area. Currently, we have homeowners taking care of fourteen beds, seven beds that homeowners are unable to maintain are adopted by volunteers, and six in the pavilion area are being done by the Flowerbed Committee. We pay to have eleven beds maintained. Volunteers Bob Scott and Jerry Webster worked on the rock border close to the Quail Creek mailbox and Bob continues to work on others. Due to age and growth several beds are being studied for major work as space is being taken and the sprinkler system is unable to work sufficiently. The goal is to maintain and enhance the beauty of our subdivision.
